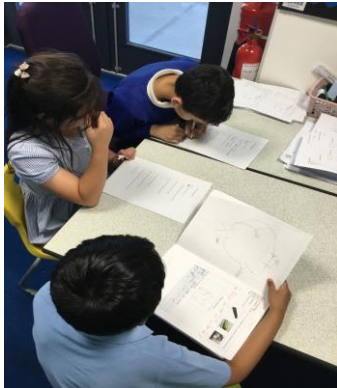

What does a student researcher do (role)?

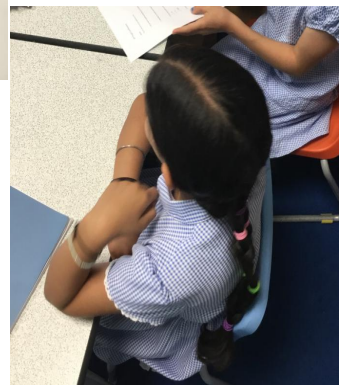


- Help other pupils with their learning and confidence

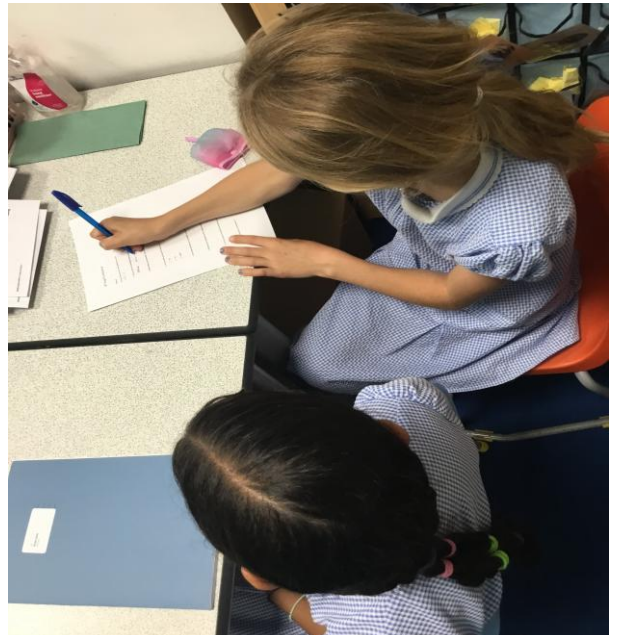
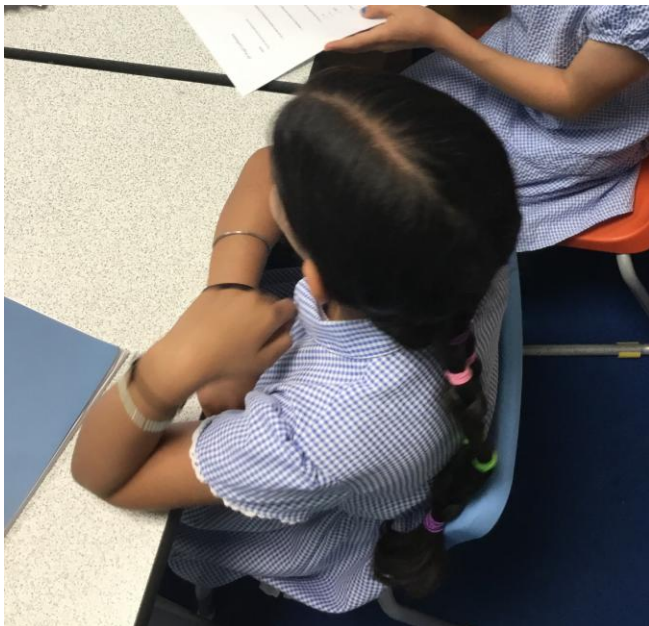
