A student researcher finds out what helps teachers and students during lessons, and what resources help them learn.

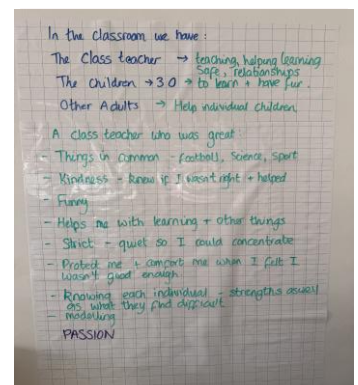
As a student researcher it is our job to ask other students what helps them and what doesn't when learning in class.

A good student researcher must (skills)...

- A good researcher needs to listen to students on what they think but also having your opinion too.
- They also need to observe classrooms carefully to gather maximum information
- But they also need to reflect on what they've done in the past
- You need to be able to make clear and simple conversations and have ideas so others understand.
